Treasurers Corner

Membership fees and voluntary donations continue to be in-line with expectations and for most funds, donations were similar or a little better than the previous year for most funds. Balances were as follows:

Unrestricted Fund - Available Balance \$54,637. The prior year's balance was \$41,765. Discretionary spending included replacement of the refrigerator and water heater in the association building.

Restricted Boat Ramp Fund – Available Balance \$-0-. The prior year's balance was \$7,857. Note- The board approved to move funds in the amount of \$4,573 from the general fund to cover the shortage in this fund.

Restricted Contingency Fund – Available Balance \$42,117. The prior year's balance was \$41,407.

Restricted Fireworks Fund – Available Balance \$52,137. The prior year's balance was \$49,114.

Restricted Fish Management Fund – Available Balance \$8,669. The prior year's balance was \$6,826.

Restricted Fishing Derby Fund - Available Balance \$2,069. The prior year's balance was \$5,789. Notespending was higher this year celebrating the 25th anniversary of the event.

Restricted Lake Beautification Fund – Available Balance \$1,880. The prior year's balance was \$974.

We continue to encourage property owners to make voluntary donations beyond the annual membership fee to the unrestricted fund, or target donations to the fund of their choice. As indicated above, the Boat Ramp Fund needs the most current support to fully fund for the recent security gate upgrade and to provide funds for additional security enhancements being considered by the board.

Thanks to everyone for their donations of both money and time to make our Association successful.



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Why Freeze Fish? Here's some tips:

Fresh fish is a tasty protein that has a relatively short shelf life. Any fish you are not planning on eating within a few days must be frozen. Properly freezing a fish does not mean tossing it into the freezer.

Here's what you need to know to have top-quality fish for months:

- Air is your enemy. Any air that touches your fish will destroy it. It's that simple. So you must prevent air from contacting the fish by vacuum-sealing it, glazing it or wrapping it tightly. (This is in order of preference.)
- If you catch a lot of fish or buy lots of fresh fish from the market, buy a vacuum sealer. A great investment to make things easier.
- If you choose not to vacuum seal, you can glaze the fish by dipping them in cold water and putting the dipped fish on a sheet pan in the freezer. Let that water freeze, then repeat the process several more times to get a 1/4 inch thick ice glaze on the fish. You can then put your glazed fish into a plastic bag and place in the freezer for storage.
- Place cleaned fillets in freezer bags, fill with water, then squeeze the air out and seal bag.
- You can wrap your fish in plastic wrap, then put the wrapped fish into a plastic bag. This method is not as effective at preventing moisture loss and freezer burn like the other methods.


Never freeze your fish for longer than 6 months. After that, you will notice a serious decline in quality. Fatty fish, such as salmon or trout, go downhill even faster. Don't freeze them longer than 3 months.

When you thaw your frozen fish, do it gradually. Never put them in the microwave to thaw. Let the fish thaw in the fridge or in cold water. Thawing at room temperature is also a bad idea. You want them to remain cold and come to temperature slowly.



Fishing Tidbits:

Selective harvest is key to ensure there are good populations of bigger fish for the future. Here's some information regarding how to get 1 pound of bluegill "meat" for the frying pan. It doesn't take too many bigger gills to reach that amount.



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
Meet One of Our New Board Members: Curt Hodges

- 5. At our meeting we will make new plans for the upcoming year.






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S'more Recipes to try at your next campfire!

Important Reminder: 911 Signage



The Lake Ponderosa Association encourages all lake residents to purchase a 911 roadside address sign. These signs are very helpful to emergency service and delivery drivers to assist them in locating the address provided quickly and accurately. Please consider purchasing a 911 sign even if you currently have your address numbers displayed on your home or mail box, those may

be difficult to see during poor visibility (night, fog, etc.). The blue/white reflective roadside signs will assist these drivers, and your family/friends, in finding your home.

Send a check in the amount of \$35.00, payable to the Lake Ponderosa Association and mail to the Lake Ponderosa Association and mail to PO Box 751, Montezuma, IA 50171. Please note "911 Sign" in the memo of the check. Include your full name, lake address and your phone number.

Once you receive your sign it should be placed within a few feet of the driveway close to the road. Sign should be perpendicular to the road and visible from either direction. Please call 811 for line locates around 48 hours prior to installation.





Don't forget to
disconnect your
garden hose

A friendly reminder to all, especially those who do not winter with us here at Lake Ponderosa.

Make sure you disconnect any garden hoses and tighten the faucet to be sure water is turned off for the winter. If you leave a garden hose attached, even with a small amount of water, it can stay lodged in the pipe by the spigot and will freeze very quickly. To best preservation of your hoses, remove all excess water and all kinks in the hose, and wind into a circle. It is best to store in a temperature-controlled location.
